

Anmore Regular Council Meeting  
October 25, 2011

The Mayor called the meeting to order at 7:00. All of the members of Council, Chief Administrative Officer, Howard Carley, and approximately ten members of the General Public were in attendance. The Agenda was approved. There were no delegations.

After identification of a few mix-ups, the Minutes of the October 11, 2011 Regular Council Meeting were approved. There were several points of clarification in the Business Arising from the Minutes. Mayor Anderson confirmed Councillor Piamonte's assumption that changes to the Noise by-law made by staff would form a baseline for the beginning of the work of the By-law Enforcement Working Group.

Councillors Isaak and McEwen moved and seconded a motion that the Anmore Domestic Waste Disposal By-law be reconsidered and adopted. Councillor Piamonte sought clarification of the definitions for single family dwellings and duplexes because the by-law and attached definitions were not the same. After much round about discussion, it appeared that the definitions of dwellings, families, suites, and residences were not clear, nor consistent. Councillor Piamonte proposed that the by-law be sent back to staff for further clarification. The by-law was tabled.

Mayor Anderson reported that the Scouts had made close to \$3,000 on their bottle drive on October 15<sup>th</sup>. As well, the Youth Group was successful in their clothing drive. She also reported on a Metro Vancouver Budget Meeting where increases will likely be 3%.

Under Councillors Reports, Councillor Isaak reminded people about the Hallowe'en night fireworks. She also talked about a tour up to Pinnacle Ridge to see how the developers plan to control groundwater run-off. She indicated that a report will be posted on the Village website. Councillor Piamonte reported on the October 21<sup>st</sup> Emergency Preparedness Working Group meeting and indicated that the Public Works Committee is meeting on Thursday, October 27<sup>th</sup>.

CAO Howard Carley indicated that long-time Village employee Karen Anne Cobb will be retiring on November 30<sup>th</sup>. He indicated that a reception is being planned.

Councillor Sedergreen had an environmental question for the CAO about possible contaminated soil on a site currently being developed in Anmore and asked if any tests had been done on the quality of the soil and tests for residual contamination. Mr. Carley replied that no tests had been done.

Question period has been suspended for the period leading up to the municipal election. The meeting was adjourned at 7:22.
