**CONDUCT OF THE PUBLIC DURING  
COUNCIL MEETINGS AND  
PUBLIC QUESTION PERIOD**

The following are the rules that must be followed:

No member of the public attending a Council Meeting may speak to Council unless that person has been recognized by the Mayor or the person presiding.

When recognized by the Mayor or person presiding, the person shall approach the podium and state their name and address for the record. The person may only ask 1 question to Council and will be allowed 2 minutes to speak. After which the person must resume their seat. When all other people have had an opportunity to ask questions, only then can a person return to the podium to ask an additional question.

No member of the public attending a Council Meeting may cause a disturbance, disrupt or in any manner delay the conduct of the business at a meeting.

No member of the public attending a Council Meeting who has been permitted or invited to speak on any matter coming before Council may use any rude or offensive language, or by tone or manner of speaking, express any point of view or opinion or make any allegation which, directly or indirectly, reflects upon the public conduct of private character of any person.

If a member of the public attending a Council Meeting resists or disobeys an order of the Mayor or other person presiding to leave a meeting of Council, that person may be removed by the Chief Administrative Officer and/or the Manager of Corporate Services or, if necessary by a Peace Officer at the direction of the Mayor or other person presiding.

The purpose of the Public Question Period is to provide the public with an opportunity to ask questions of Council on items that are of concern to them.

Public Question Period will be suspended from the beginning of the nomination period of a General Local Government Election or By-Election, until the meeting of Council following the Election.

**11. NEW BUSINESS**

Councillor Sedergreen wanted to discuss 2 items relating to the upcoming Election. The first item was to do with eligibility of Volunteer Firefighters. At that point Councillor Palmer Isaak called a Point of Order and requested that Council should not be discussing staffing issues at a Regular Council Meeting and that it should be discussed at an In-Camera Council Meeting. Mayor Anderson agreed and suggested that Councillor Sedergreen refer this matter to In-Camera Council. Councillor Sedergreen did not agree and believes the residents of the Village of Anmore have a right to know what the Staff is doing and what is happening. Councillor Palmer Isaak reiterated her Point of Order and noted that a legal opinion was received about criticizing staff publically and should

refrain from doing so. Mayor Anderson agreed and requested that Councillor Sedergreen not talk about our staff in this public way. Mayor Anderson suggested that if Councillor Sedergreen had issues regarding how the election is being run that he contact either the Chief Election Officer or the Deputy Chief Election Officer with his concerns. Mayor Anderson stated that it is imperative that the politicians stay out of how the election is run.

Councillor Sedergreen advised that the other issue regarding the Elections is the Election bylaw in that there is some confusion on when candidates would be allowed to erect election signs. Mayor Anderson suggested that anyone who is confused about this should contact the Chief Election Officer. Howard Carley, CAO and the Deputy Chief Election Officer advised that there was a typo in the bylaw and the intent is clear that elections signs should not be erected until November 1<sup>st</sup>. If there are any further questions regarding this matter that candidates contact Mrs. Cobb who is the Chief Election Officer.

VILLAGE OF ANMORE

BYLAW NO. 514-2011

A bylaw to provide a system for the collection and disposal of domestic waste and recyclables

---

The Council of the Village of Anmore in open meeting assembled; enacts as follows:

**CITATION**

- 1.1 This bylaw may be cited for all purposes of "Anmore Domestic Waste Collection and Disposal Bylaw No. 514-2011".

**REPEALMENT**

- 2.1 That "Anmore Solid Waste Disposal Bylaw No. 120-1993" is hereby repealed.

**INTERPRETATION**

- 3.1 In this bylaw:

**"Bylaw Enforcement Officer"** means the person appointed by Council to enforce the Village's bylaws;

**"Collection Service"** means the service established by this bylaw for the curbside collection of domestic waste and recyclables from residences within the Village;

**"contractor"** means the company retained by the Village to perform the collection and disposal of domestic waste and recyclables;

**"construction and demolition waste"** means all earth, debris, rocks, trees, stumps, building materials and anything else originating from the construction, demolition or renovation of buildings and structures;

**"Council"** means the Council of the Village of Anmore;

**"domestic waste"** means waste from residential uses, but does not include recyclables or include items listed in Section 1 of Schedule "B";

**"domestic waste collection day"** means the day established by the Village for the curbside collection of domestic waste and recyclables;

**“Environmental Law”** means all federal, provincial, municipal or local laws, statutes or ordinances relating to environmental matters, including all rules, regulations, criteria or the like promulgated under or pursuant to any such laws;

**“garbage container”** means a domestic waste receptacle constructed of non-corrosive durable metal or plastic, equipped with a tight fitting cover constructed of the same or similar materials, having a weight of no more than 25 pounds, and that is capable of being manually emptied and being securely closed to reduce odours and reasonably prevent access by animals;

**“garbage tags”** means the tag required to be used for the collection of domestic waste;

**“household hazardous product”** means a substance and any product used to contain it which is explosive, corrosive, flammable, reactive and/or toxic and which originates from residential sources in quantities, which are exempt from the application of Section 2(6) of the *Special Waste Regulation* under the *Environmental Management Act*, as amended from time to time;

**“land clearing waste”** means all earth, debris, rocks, trees, stumps and anything else originating from clearing land or landscaping;

**“recyclables”** means recyclables from residential uses listed in Section 1 of Schedule “C”;

**“recycling containers”** means the blue boxes, blue bags, yellow bags and 240 litre blue totes for depot collection which are available for purchase at the Village Municipal Hall;

**“residence”** means a single family dwelling or a duplex that receives the Collection Services;

**“special waste”** includes the items listed in Section 1 of Schedule “B”; and

**“Village”** means the Village of Anmore;

- 3.2 Except as otherwise defined in this bylaw, words and phrases in this bylaw are to be construed in accordance with their meanings under the *Community Charter*. Words in the singular include the plural and gender specific terms include both genders and corporations. A reference to a statute in this bylaw refers to a statute of the Province of British Columbia unless otherwise indicated, and a reference to any statute, regulation, code or bylaw refers to that enactment as it may be amended or replaced from time to time. The headings in this bylaw are for convenience only and must not be construed as defining or in any limiting the scope or intent of this bylaw. If any portion of this bylaw is found invalid by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalid portion is severed without effect in the remaining portions of this bylaw.

- 3.3 This bylaw must not be construed as restricting any owner or occupier of property in the Village from hauling his own waste to an approved transfer station or facility authorized by a local government, British Columbia or Canada to accept that waste.

#### **GENERAL REGULATIONS**

- 4.1 A person must not:

- (a) dump or dispose of any waste except in accordance with the provisions of this bylaw or by direction authorized by the Manager of Public Works.
- (b) deposit or use waste for lot filling or leveling purposes.
- (c) permit, suffer or allow waste of any kind whatsoever to leak, spill, blow or drop from any vehicle or container onto any street within the Village.
- (d) place or caused to be placed any waste upon any street or public land other than in accordance with the residential waste collection service conditions.
- (e) dispose of waste into a container belonging to another person without the consent of the owner or occupier of the premises.
- (f) dispose of any special waste except in a safe and lawful manner, and using services and facilities designed and authorized under provincial or federal law to accept the kind of special waste that is being discarded; or
- (g) open any container, add anything thereto or in any way disturb or tamper with the contents thereof, or in any way handle, interfere with, disturb or tamper with any container placed for collection, unless the person is:
  - (i) the owner or occupant of the relevant property;
  - (ii) a Bylaw Enforcement Officer acting in the course of duty; or
  - (iii) employed by the Contractor or Village to carry out the Collection Service.

- 4.2 Every owner or occupier of a residence for which the Collection Service is provided must ensure that any and all domestic waste is bagged securely in plastic bags of sufficient size and strength, and placed inside a garbage container for the collection by Contractor.

#### **RESIDENTIAL DOMESTIC WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE**

- 5.1 A Collection Service is established to provide for the collection of domestic waste and recyclables from single family dwellings and duplex residences within the Village.

- 5.2 The Chief Administrative Officer is authorized to act on behalf of the Village to negotiate and execute a service agreement with a Residential Domestic Waste Collection Service and to establish Collection Service schedules, billing, complaint and enforcement procedures, notifications and to arrange for and do all other things necessary and incidental to providing the Collection Service in accordance with this bylaw, the *Community Charter* and other applicable enactments.
- 5.3 The Collection Service will include but not be limited to the systematic and regularly scheduled emptying of garbage and recycling containers placed by residents on the curbside or beside the street in front of their property for the disposal of the contents of domestic waste and recyclables.
- 5.4 Domestic waste collection day shall be established by the Manager of Public Works and the Contractor.
- 5.5 Garbage and recycling containers must be placed on the street for collection no earlier than 5:00 a.m. and no later than 8:00 a.m. on domestic waste collection days.
- 5.6 Garbage and recycling containers once emptied must be removed from the road no later than 24 hours after domestic waste collection day.

#### **FEES AND CHARGES**

- 6.1 All residents must
- (a) pay the annual recycling levy set out in Schedule "A";
  - (b) if utilizing the solid waste collection, purchase garbage tags from the Village or its' authorized agents at the rate prescribed in Schedule "A" of this bylaw; and
  - (c) affix a garbage tag to each garbage container in a visible location.
- 6.2 All owners of single family dwellings and residential duplexes receiving the Collection Service shall be charged the annual recycling levy set out in Schedule "A", which will be included on the annual property tax notices and shall be payable by July 2<sup>nd</sup> of the year in which it is payable.
- 6.3 A recycling levy that is not paid by December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year in which it is payable may be treated as taxes in arrears and may be collected in the same manner and with the same remedies as property taxes.

#### **ENFORCEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION PROVISIONS**

- 7.1 This bylaw may be enforced by the Chief Administrative Officer, the Manager of Public Works or by any Bylaw Enforcement Officer, who may be assisted by other employees of the Village or a peace officer as considered necessary in the circumstances.

7.2 A person who:

- (a) contravenes, violates or fails to comply with any provision of this bylaw;
- (b) fails or neglects to do anything required to be done under this bylaw; or
- (c) suffers or allows any action or thing to be done in contravention of this bylaw, or any notice or direction made under this bylaw,

commits an offence and where the offence is a continuing one, each day that the offence is continued constitutes a separate offence.

7.3 A person convicted of an offence under this bylaw is liable to pay either of the following penalties:

- (a) a fine of up to \$1,000.00 if issued a ticket under *Anmore Municipal Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw*; or
- (b) a fine of up to a maximum \$10,000.00 if prosecuted under the *Offence Act*.

7.4 Recurring non-compliance of any provision of this bylaw that may affect the integrity of the Waste Collection System may result in suspension of the service pursuant to the *Community Charter*.

7.5 Persons deemed to be in non-compliance will be provided reasonable notice of the suspension and will have opportunity to make representation to Council pursuant to the *Community Charter*.

7.6 Schedules "A", "B" and "C" are attached to and form part of this bylaw.

**DOMESTIC WASTE**

- 1. Garbage Tags \$3.00 each

Please note: 1 garbage tag is for 1 standard size garbage container.  
Maximum weight of garbage bag is 13.5 kg (30 lbs.)

**RECYCLING FEES AND LEVIES**

- 1. Annual Recycling Levy

1. "Special waste" includes any of the following:
  - a. animal or human feces;
  - b. agricultural waste;
  - c. biomedical, medical or pathological waste or sharps (syringes, needles, injection devices, blades and similar items);
  - d. dangerous or highly offensive wastes, including, without limitation, all substances within the definition of hazardous waste in the *Hazardous Waste Regulation* under the *Environmental Management Act*;
  - e. substances listed in the Contaminated Sites Regulation under the Environmental Management Act;
  - f. dead animal carcasses;
  - g. construction or demolition materials;
  - h. free water or other liquids;
  - i. furniture;
  - j. grease in any form, unless securely wrapped or enclosed in waterproof material;
  - k. gyproc or gypsum wallboard;
  - l. land clearing waste;
  - m. material that is or may become explosive;
  - n. highly flammable materials;
  - o. hot or loose ashes;
  - p. household batteries, whether rechargeable or non-rechargeable;
  - q. paint;

- r. pesticides;
  - s. petroleum-based oils, containers and filters (motor oil and oil filters, lubricating oil, transmission oil, hydraulic oil, and similar oils);
  - t. rocks;
  - u. vehicle parts or heavy pieces of metal;
  - v. wire.
2. A person must not include any special waste among domestic waste items that are placed for collection by the Collection Service.
  3. Every person must dispose of any and all special waste in a safe and lawful manner and using services and facilities designed and appropriately licensed to accept the kind of special waste that is being discarded.
